Mary takes her most expensive perfume. She soothes Jesus' head. The disciples are furious. They know better.

Researchers tell us that in Roman times women healers used perfume or oil to anoint people suffering anxiety and stress.

Jesus carried the weight of people's disappointment, sorrow, pain, suffering. He knew ultimate isolation was approaching, execution and death. The woman noticed, acted, released healing. A beautiful thing.

Many posts on social media have enhanced beautiful things, the opportunities to 'stop and smell the roses'; to be creative with people.

At the heart of our good news story Jesus says – wherever the good news is told the story of Mary's gift will be told.

Your bubble maybe getting a bit restrictive, more like a balloon deflating. Holy Week reminds us that God in Jesus had that experience. On Thursday and Friday Jesus absorbs the ugliness of violence in order to break the power of violence. Today he relaxes in the healing of touch, smell, sound and sight.

Look at the images – connect with your memory of our community and place. Find something with a smell - lavender, herbs/ spices from the pantry, a plant from the

garden-breathe.

Have a shower or bath, let the water run over you. Give thanks for the water of new life.
